

Have you noticed that something funny has gotten into our parents since they became grandparents? When we were kids, they were sticklers for rules. Now it seems there are no rules. When we were kids, we were subjected to strict bedtimes with barely an exception. Now, the same people who kept us in our beds after 7:30 every night, are keeping our kids out way past their bedtimes, even though we told them to be back. When we were young, you couldn't have a snack after 3:00 in the afternoon because "it will spoil your appetite for supper". Now, the same people who ruled us with an iron fist waltz our kids into the house at supper time with a Slurpee in one hand and an ice cream cone in the other. And, don't even get me started on the games, toys, and gifts we could never have that they shower on our kids. What gives?

Parenting is a serious job, and we very rightly take it seriously. Raising a child is an awesome responsibility, one that cannot be taken lightly. But, the best way to mess up a serious responsibility is to take it too seriously. Lightening things up breaks tension and makes everything go more smoothly.

In the grand scheme of life and child-rearing, many adults will play very important roles in our children's lives. We, the parents, have an obviously vital role. *Rebbeim*, teachers, counselors, neighbors, and friends will also influence how our children develop. But, perhaps the single most important adult relationship in our children's lives is their relationship with grandparents.

First, and foremost, those of us who have children fortunate enough to have grandparents who are part of their lives should pause for a moment and reflect on that blessing. Grandparents provide wisdom, experience, perspective, and patience that we, as young parents, may not have fully developed yet. But, they play an even more vital role in our children's emotional health.

Parents love their children unconditionally, but that doesn't mean that our relationship with them comes without conditions. We need to set expectations for and make demands of our children. We need to enforce those demands as well. That often pits us against our children. Who then can they turn to for complete unconditional love and support? That would be the grandparents!


When grandparents partner with grandchildren in crime and conspire against you, the responsible parent of your children, they are not undermining your *chinuch*. Just the opposite. They are providing you, the parent, the leeway to act as the responsible adult without worrying that your child might feel unloved or unsupported. If you're worried about how being strict with your child might negatively affect his self-esteem, a little time in person or on Skype with a grandparent can assuage that concern.

So, if you think that your once strict and reasonable parents have lost their minds since becoming grandparents, don't fear. They are just playing their role on the stage that is life. In that state, they'll help you so you can be free to raise your child the right way.


