Bnos Bracha Takes Special Bas Mitzvah Trip To Philadelphia

On Tuesday, January 14, **Bnos Bracha Elementary** School took a group of their pre- and post-bas mitzvah girls on a memorable trip to Philadelphia. In addition to stopping at the traditional sights, such as the Liberty Bell and Congress Hall, site of President George Washington's second inauguration, the trip had a much deeper and more inspiring fundamental purpose, as the girls paid a visit to Harav Shmuel Kamenetsky, shlita, and his Rebbetzin.

Before the trip, the school's principal, Mrs. Sarah Eidlitz, had asked Harav Kamenetsky to suggest an important mitzvah for the girls to take upon themselves as a special kabbal*ah* for life. In response, the Rav took time out of his busy schedule to meet with the girls and give them divrei brachah. He

spoke to the girls at length, stressing that bnos Yisrael are all daughters of the King. The girls were highly attentive to the message that as princesses they have been given the Torah, which is, among other things, a book of etiquette that tells them how to speak with refinement and act with refinement.

The Rebbetzin went on to explain that as children of the King, princesses don't need the approval of the rest of the world to know they are special. They

suggested that the students be mekabel the mitzvah of tznius. The Rosh Yeshivah also discussed the great merit a woman earns for supporting Torah.

"The trip to Philadelphia to see Harav Shmuel Kamenetsky was inspiring, exciting and interesting," said Basy Kahn, a sixth-grader at Bnos Bracha. "The Rav and Rebbetzin spoke about the importance of tznius, and the Rebbetzin talked to us about why we are special. Their home was very cozy, and we got to daven Minchah in their living room. I felt very honored to be there; Harav Shmuel came from yeshivah just to speak to us. I left feeling very proud to be a daughter of Hashem (which

know who they are - princesses - and therefore conduct themselves with the utmost dignity in their dress and speech.

They treat their bodies with dignity as well, not only through tznius but also by having self-esteem and eating healthy foods, thereby showing respect for their bodies inside and out. In this way, Rebbetzin Kamenetsky was able to convey her unique message to her eager listeners, showing that tznius is all-encompassing and not done just for the outside.

She also cautioned the girls not to think that because they dress in a tzniusdig fashion, they should be judgmental of

others who don't dress in the same way. The Rebbetzin suggested that the girls use their innate sensitivity not to hurt others but to understand with the binah yeseirah unique to women how to help and not hurt others. The girls were noticeably impressed by what they heard.

"I love what Rebbetzin Kamenetsky said about tznius," said Raichel Arons, one of the sixth-graders.

Before they all davened a moving Minchah together, Rebbetzin Kamenetsky went on to tell the girls that women have a special middah of chessed built into them. To illustrate her point, the Rebbetzin mentioned the brachah of "She'asani Kirtzono," where women say that they are like Hashem, Who does chessed. Thus, she suggested that the girls work on developing this middah to do chessed and nurture others.

Rebbetzin Kamenetsky suggested that Bnos Bracha include in its curriculum mitzvos bein adam lachaveiro, starting from the youngest grades. Apparently Bnos Bracha has already begun to do this. Developing this *middah* of chessed will undoubtedly serve Bnos Bracha students well as part of the future of Klal Yisrael and as a continuation of our mesorah.
