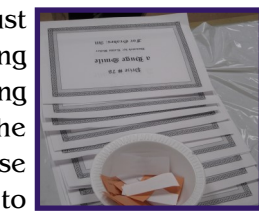
course, eating the delicious food! Congratulations 7B on a huge accomplishment! May it be the first of many more to come!

a few of the amazing prizes that were being raffled off by the eighth grade Chinese Auction! Congrats to all of the lucky winners!



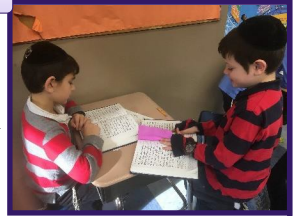
