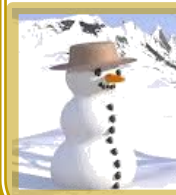

Parenting in the Parsha

פרשת וישב

Sibling Rivalry

וַיִּשְׂרָאֵל אֶהָב אֶת־יֹסֵף מִכָּל־בָּנָיו כִּי־בְוֶזְמָנָם הָיָא לּוֹ וַעֲשָׂה לּוֹ כְּתֹנֶת פָּסִים:

Now Yisroel loved Yosef best of all his sons, for he was the child of his old age; and he had made him an ornamented tunic.

Never has a coat been the source of more trouble than the multi-colored coat that Yaakov made specially for his favorite son, Yosef. That coat began the chain of events that eventually led to the sale of Yosef in slavery to Egypt and culminated with the forced enslavement of the entire Jewish people in *Mitzrayim*.

The *gemara* in Shabbos and Megilah is unusually critical of Yaakov and his parenting in this episode, and warns us to learn the lesson from his mistakes, exhorting us to never favor one child over another, as the consequences can be horrific.

It is a simple point. So simple, in fact, that it almost needs not be said. And yet, many parents inadvertently or unthinkingly find themselves violating this most basic precept. Sometimes the favoritism is more overt, like a fancy coat for one son and not the others, and sometimes it is more subtle, taking the form of spending more time with, giving more attention to, or having more patience with one child over another. Sometimes the favoritism isn't real, but imagined by a child who is feeling bad about him or herself. Even so, the child's perception of being less loved is harmful and damaging.

At the same time, we are all aware that it is ludicrous to assume that we should be giving equal time and attention to all our children. An infant clearly needs more time and parental attention than a teenager. A special-needs child, or one dealing with illness, would need greater attention than a child free of these issues.

How, then, do we balance the need to allocate our attention based on the needs of our unique children while at the same time making them feel equally loved? Here are some concrete steps we can take:

Watch your language

Be very careful in the words that you use. Never compare a child to a sibling (or a friend or relative). Never say things that imply that a child might in any way be bad, inferior or otherwise unlovable. Never criticize the child, but the wrongful actions of the child. And, keep score of the number of critical comments you make to your child vs. the number of supportive ones. Shoot for a minimum ratio of seven positive, supportive comments for each negative one.

Track your time

Although it may be unwise to divide your time equally between all of your children, you still want to ensure that you are allotting significant time to each of them. Track the time you spend with each child and adjust accordingly. Keeping the data also helps to reassure the child who mistakenly believes he isn't getting enough time. Rotate the seating around your dining room table so that each child gets to sit near you at some time.

Make your love unconditional

Sometimes parents, in a misguided attempt to motivate and drive their children to success, will withhold their love from the child unless and until some target is met. That is a terrible mistake. Children need to know that their parents love them unconditionally, and not because they perform well at sports, in school, or even in behavior and respect. Liza Baker is the author of a children's book entitled, *I Love You Because You're You*. The book is a valuable lesson for children and parents alike about the unconditional love a parent must have for a child.

Find something special in each child

Find, focus on, and foster a special quality in each of your children. Every child has value and greatness and our job as parents is to seek and develop it. We are talent scouts for our children, and we must uncover their talents and abilities. Bond with each child individually in a unique way, making sure he knows how important he or she is to you.

Some parents mistakenly believe that the best way to mitigate sibling rivalry is to make sure that their children know that no child is the favorite. The best way to insure against sibling rivalry is to make sure that each and every child believes that he or she is your favorite. And, you'd better be nice to all your children, because together they will choose your nursing home!

Dear *Talmidim* and Parents,

There is a special *mitzvah* for every one of us to hear the weekly *parsha* read in *shul* each Shabbos and for each person to review the *parsha* on his own. The reason for that *mitzvah* is so that we can learn the *halachos* and the lessons that are contained in each week's *parsha*.

The Torah is filled with stories and with examples of *tzaddikim* who show us how we are supposed to act and also with examples of those who are not *tzaddikim* who show us how not to act. All of the *middos*, the good character traits that we expect from ourselves and from our *talmidim* can be found in the Torah.

In every *Parsha*, we can find examples of respect, responsibility, and *ruach* that we can apply to our own lives. As part of our three "R"s program, we are asking you to look through the *parsha* to find an example of respect, responsibility, or *ruach*. Each week, you will be given a paper on which you will be able to write down the examples you find in the *parsha*. At the bottom of that paper, you will find a space for you to write down a connection that you can make between the example in the *parsha* and your own life. In that space, you should write down one thing that you can do in your own life to follow the example you found in the *parsha*.

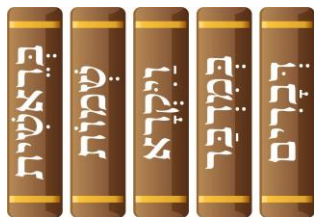

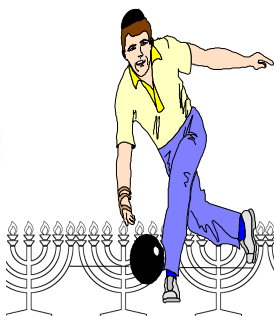
