### Parenting in the Parsha

#### פרשת אחרי מות Safety by Association

Hashem spoke to Moses after the death of the two sons of Aaron who died when they drew too close to the presence of the L-RD.

What is this statement intended to tell us? Rabbi Elazar ben Azariah illustrated this by a parable: It may be compared to the case of a sick person whom the physician visited. He (the physician) said to him: "Do not eat cold things nor sleep in a damp place!" Another physician came and said to him: "Do not eat cold things, nor sleep in a damp place so that you will not die as Mr. So-and-so died!" Certainly this (the latter) put him on his guard more than the former; that is why it states "after the death of the two sons of Aaron"

Just as courage is the danger of life, so is fear its safeguard.

Kids have a special knack for being very unafraid of things they should be scared of, while being terrified of things that should hold no fear. Young children may be afraid of imaginary monsters in their closet, but not afraid of running into traffic. They may have no fear of poisonous substances or of fire, while being scared of the dark or of harmless bugs. One of the most harrowing aspects of parenting is the constant need for vigilance in trying to protect our children from harm. And, it doesn't get any easier when our children become teenagers without a healthy fear of drinking, smoking or other harmful, addictive habits. Must we simply resign ourselves to the folly of youth, or can we help them to become more responsible and careful?


Many of us operate under the presumption that young kids and teenagers engage in risky behavior because they tend to underestimate the gravity of the risk and to overestimate their own invincibility. A fascinating study conducted a number of years ago by the University of Toronto found the exact opposite to be true. Teenagers actually tend to overestimate the risk and danger of many behaviors in which they engage. They tend to feel that the risk of dying from cancer from smoking, for example, is far greater than statistics bear out. Yet, they still engage in the risky behavior. What gives?

The researchers at the University of Toronto believe that they have the answer. Adults who refrain from dangerous behavior don't make a conscious calculation each time they are confronted with the opportunity to engage in such behavior. That is simply not how people work. Rather, people develop unconscious associations that then govern their behavior and naturally keep them safe. As an example, an adult who comes upon a hot stove does not then think about what might happen if he touched the stove and consider the harm to his hand and the pain that he will suffer. Nobody thinks like that. Instead, the adult has already developed an unconscious association that heat of fire is dangerous and should be avoided. Kids have simply not had the time to develop those subconscious associations.

How do we help them? The answer lies in *Rash*<sup>*r*</sup>*i* at the beginning of the *Parsha*. We need to highlight and emphasize those associations for them, repeatedly exposing them to the danger and harm that result. Aharon *Hakohen* did not yet have the time to develop the association between entering the *kodesh kodashim* and the danger that is entailed. Hashem instructed Moshe not just to tell him of the danger, but to highlight and help develop that association for Aharon. It is not a simple direction to be careful when entering the *kodesh*. It is a clear association that hits close to home that will help Aharon steer clear of the danger.

We often tend to make the mistake of assuming that if we emphasize how dangerous an activity is, then our children will avoid it. We then wonder what is wrong with the kid who gravitates towards that very behavior. That child already believes the behavior to be more dangerous than you do. What he needs is repeated exposure to the consequences of that behavior so that he can develop the unconscious association that will protect him from harm. That fear will then become his safeguard.




