Good judgment comes with experience, but experience comes from bad judgment

If you have ever thought that your teenage child is out of his or her mind, you're not far from the neuropsychological truth. Advances in neuropsychology in the last century and a half have given us much insight into how our brains work and why the brains of adolescents don't work the same way as those of adults.

To oversimplify matters, in the center of the brain sits a region of neurons called the Amygdala, part of the limbic system, which is the control center for our emotions. At the front of the brain is the Prefrontal Cortex, which is the region that acts as a check on emotional behavior, offering logical reasoning over pure emotion. Studies and reallife cases have shown that when the Prefrontal Cortex is damaged, people will engage in behavior that is not socially acceptable and is driven by pure emotion over reason.

Brain scans have shown that there is a gap between the development of the Amygdala in children and the eventual development of the Prefrontal Cortex. In adolescents, the emotional system is up and running at full strength, while the Prefrontal Cortex will not fully develop until a child has passed his teenage years. The result of this phenomenon is that teenagers are a hotbed of magnified emotions and poor judgment. It's not their fault. It really is neurological.


The *sefer Hachinuch* notes the different rules that govern the *Kohen Gadol's* experience with the death of a relative vs. those that govern a regular Kohen. He explains that a *Kohen Gadol* is expected to be so pure and holy that he will be able to keep his emotions in check, even with the death of a close relative. That is an expectation that can only be demanded of a *Kohen Gadol*. It is not the Torah's expectation with a regular *Kohen*, who is allowed and required to become *tamei* on the death of a close relative. The *parsha* of *tumas Kohanim* is essentially a study in the rule of emotion over logic, of the times where the limbic system will get the better of the prefrontal Cortex.

If that is true for the adult *kohanim*, how much more so for the youth. They are already more prone to be governed by emotion and are not able to control it the same way that adults can. Perhaps, that is the lesson that Rash"i is bringing out for us here. The repetition of the phrase, *emor v'amarta* warns us that the adults should be mindful of the children. On the level of *pshat* it means that the adults must apply the rules of *tumas kohanim* to their underage boys as well. But, on a deeper level, perhaps the Torah is admonishing us to be mindful of the children and their inability to rein in their emotions. The child, every day, is emotionally comparable to the adult Kohen who has lost a close relative. He is unable to keep his emotions in check and incapable of having reason triumph over emotion.

That does not mean that we should simply allow our children to engage in dangerous and potentially harmful behavior. What it does mean is that we should be mindful of the emotional triggers that will drive our children's behaviors and mindful of our need to act for them as the rational check on those behaviors.

So, the next time your teenage son or daughter acts like an emotional basket-case, or the next time he or she displays incredibly poor judgment, don't panic. Your child is normal and will grow to have good, rational judgment. You just have to keep him safe until he gets there.

Dear Parent of grades 1-8,

It is our great pleasure to introduce to you the **Kamocha Campaign**! The purpose of this campaign, presented by the Chofetz Chaim Heritage Foundation, is to provide a program for children to help them develop an effective tool needed to live in harmony with the people in their lives.

There is a profound Torah lesson that is so powerful, it can curtail bullying, cure insensitivity, build *shalom bayis* in the future and foster *ehrlichkeit* in our children. This entire lesson is contained in only ten words taught to us by Hillel: (שבת כא:א) "(שבת כא:א)"; *that which you don't want done to you, do not do unto your friend— this is [a reflection of] the entire Torah.*

To this end, the **Kamocha Campaign** has been developed to give children the means to discover for themselves the positive impact of thinking, "How would *I* feel?" before saying or doing something to another person, and to make their own commitments to change their behavior accordingly. "How Would I Feel?" can become a catchphrase in every class and school, instilling in the children's hearts the very core of what the Torah sets out to teach the Jewish people. Your child's class will take on a joint *kabbalah(os)* to improve the way they treat others in a particular area. Over the next four weeks, special projects will help them further internalize this program's message, and incentives will be provided to help keep up the excitement. This powerful **Kamocha Campaign** will run during the days of *sefirah*, a most opportune time for the children to be working on *bein adam lachaveiro*.



Bike & Roller Blades Transport Information:

Going: Bikes should be brought to YKOR on <u>Wednesday</u> between 5:00 and 6:00 p.m. They will be loaded onto a truck that will transport them on Thursday morning to the park. Should you wish to transport your son's bike yourself, please be at the park on Thursday morning by 10:15 to drop it off. PLEASE <u>DO NOT</u> BRING YOUR SON'S BIKE TO YESHIVA ON THURSDAY MORNING.

Returning: Bikes will be available for pickup from YKOR between 4:00 and 5:00 on Thursday afternoon. Should you wish to transport your son's bike home yourself, please be at the park by 12:00 p.m. All remaining bikes will be loaded on the truck when it is ready to leave by 12:30.

*Any parents that are <u>able</u> to bring their son's bike to the park, it would be appreciated, as there is limited space on the truck.

Additional Important Information:

- **HELMETS ARE REQUIRED!** For their safety, *talmidim* will not be allowed to ride or roller blade without a helmet.
- Wrist guards are recommended for roller blading.
- Please pack sun screen, adequate drinks, snacks and a bag-lunch for your son.
- *Talmidim* may wear t-shirts, no-shorts please.
- Adequate supervision around the lake is being provided thanks to the Rebbeim and the N'shei.


