PARENTING the PARSHA



כי תבוא Toil and Trouble

וַיִּשְׁמַע ה' אֶת־קֹלֵנוּ וַיִּרְא אֶת־עָנְיֶנוּ וְאֶת־עֲמָלֵנוּ וַיִּרְא ואַת־לַחַצֵנוּ:

and the L-RD heard our plea and saw our plight, our misery, and our oppression.

ואת עמלנו אלו הבנים כמו שנאמר כל הבן הילוד "And our toil" this refers to the children as it says "any boy that is born you shall cast into the Nile"

- Hagadah Shel Pesach

Children are called "toil" because a person toils in raising them. We find similarly "Why should G-d be angry at your voice and harm the work of your hands" that refers to the children as it says, for the sin of (unfulfilled) promises children die.

I have learned that raising children is the single most difficult thing in the world to do. It takes hard work, love, luck, and a lot of energy, and it is the most rewarding experience that you can ever have.

Congratulations! You got the job. It is an important job, perhaps the single most

important occupation known to mankind. The responsibility is enormous, the pay is horrible (in fact, you will pay hundreds of thousands of dollars for the privilege of holding this job), the hours are endless, and you get no education or training in how to properly do your job. Welcome to parenthood.

In the vidui Bikkurim found in this week's parsha the Torah lays out for us the narrative that the bringer of bikkurim is expected to relate to the *Kohen*. Part of that narrative is the description of how G-d saw our toil in the Land of Egypt. The author of the hagadah had no doubt that the word toil refers to our children for, as the *Shibolei* Haleket explains, there is no area in our lives that demands greater toil than the raising of our children. If you are reading this, then likely you are a parent, and, if so, you don't need to be told that parenting is hard. So why am I telling you?

We tend to think, mistakenly, that because having children is natural, that parenting skills should come naturally, and we sometimes view the effort to seek guidance and help in our parenting as a sign of weakness or incompetence. That is a dangerous and flawed assumption. Parenting is very hard, and the parenting

skills you think you learned growing up in your parents' home are not always enough to get the job done. Even if you were fortunate enough to grow up in the perfect home with perfect parents who always got it right, you watched them parent you through the undeveloped eyes of a child. You may not know the behind-the-scenes planning and choreographing that went into the tip of the parenting iceberg that you witnessed. You may not remember everything they did with full accuracy. Even if you remember what they did, it does not mean that you possess the skills to repeat their action. Also, you may not have grown up in the perfect home.

Make use of the myriad resources out there on parenting. If you consume your information in book form, there is a whole section in the library (and on Amazon) dedicated to child rearing. If you prefer the short article format of a magazine, try Parents magazine in print or online. If you are more inclined to in-person classes, they are available, and if you prefer video as your go-to resource for information, there are many quality video resources for parenting tips and education. Be discerning and careful in where you choose to source your information. Look for recommendations and ask yourself "what

are the credentials of the individual dispensing parenting advice?" Bad information is worse than no information. But, find the right resources and take advantage of them.

Be real about how difficult parenting is.
Don't think it's just you or just your children who are having a difficult time. It's hard for everyone, even those who play like it's all perfect on Instagram. Treat the job of parenting with the respect it deserves.
Recognize that nobody can be on duty for a job that stressful and that demanding without ever taking a break. Schedule time for yourself to recharge and revitalize. You are of no help to your children if you're always on duty but never engaged. Take the time off so that your time on will be on.

Yes, parenting is very hard, but it is not impossible. It takes humility, patience, siyata dishemaya and the wisdom to seek the help that you need to navigate the hardest, but most rewarding job you will ever have.







MEALS PROGRAMS

BREAKFAST - Yeshiva Ketana Grades 6-8/Breakfast is included in the Mesivta and Bais Medrash at no extra charge: The Breakfast Program includes milk, a variety of cereals and prepared hot food (either pancakes or eggs). Milk is provided daily free of charge for all students who want to bring cereal from home.

LUNCH- All divisions: Meals are provided by Continental Kosher Catering under the hashgacha of Rabbi Yechiel Steinmetz, shlit"a.

SUPPER- Mesivta and Beis Medrash: Suppers are provided by Ephi's Catering under the hashgacha of Rabbi Yitzchok Heimowitz of Yeshiva Shaarei Torah. *For students in grades 9-12 who are not in dorm, supper is only served on days that the Mesivta has regular English sessions. Dorm Meal Option (F) supper is served all days, even those when there are no regular English sessions.
