Reminder from The YKOR Parent Handbook:

As a Yeshivas Ohr Rueven *chinuch* partner, it is understood that the way a parent dresses, whether on a Sunday, at a *simcha* or out shopping, has a tremendous effect on our *talmidim*. "Do as I say, not as I do," is a recipe for confusion at best. All the more so when coming to the yeshiva grounds, all fathers and mothers are requested to not only dress with *tznius*, but with proper *koved rosh* for our *makom Torah*. Men should wear shirts and slacks (and jackets when joining the YOR minyan). Women are to follow all guidelines of the *Shulchan Aruch*. Please see to it that clothing is of proper length and sufficiently loose-fitting. Proper hair covering is required and legs must be fully covered, not with a look more appropriate for the gym, (i.e.: leggings). **These guidelines apply at all times** especially when parents come to drop off or pick up their children. Please be extra sensitive as we share a campus with a *Yeshiva Gedolah* and *Beis Medrash*.

Parenting in the Parsha

כי תצא One Voice

ָוְאָמְרًוּ אֶל־זִקְנֵי עִירוֹ בְּנֵנוּ זֶהֹ סוֹרֵר וּמֹלֶה אֵינֶנוּ שֹׁמֵעַ בְּקֹלֵנוּ זוֹלֵלָ וְסֹבֵא:

They shall say to the elders of his town, "This son of ours is disloyal and defiant; he does not heed us. He is a glutton and a drunkard."

רבי יהודה אומר אם לא היתה אמו שוה לאביו בקול ובמראה ובקומה אינו נעשה בן סורר ומורה מאי טעמא דאמר קרא איננו שומע בקלנו מדקול בעינן שוין מראה וקומה נמי בעינן שוין Rabbi Yehuda says: If his mother was not identical to his father in voice, appearance, and height, he does not become a stubborn and rebellious son. The Gemara asks: What is the reason for this? As the verse states: "He will not obey our voices [kolenu]" (Deuteronomy 21:20), which indicates that they both have the same voice. And since we require that they be identical in voice, we also require that they be identical in appearance and height.

The Gemara asks: In accordance with whose opinion is that which is taught in a baraita: There has never been a stubborn and rebellious son and there will never be one in the future, and why, then, was the passage relating to a stubborn and rebellious son written in the Torah? So that you may expound upon new understandings of the Torah and receive reward for your learning. In accordance with whose opinion is this? It is in accordance with the opinion of Rabbi Yehuda, who requires that the parents have certain identical characteristics, making it virtually impossible to apply the halakha

- Sanhedrin 71a

A house divided against itself cannot stand.

The *gemara* in Sanhedrin tells us that there are a limited number of *parshios* in the Torah that never happened and never will. One of those *parshios* is the *halachic parsha* of *ben sorer u'moreh*, the wayward child. The *gemara* tells us that according to Rebi Yehuda a child can only be designated a *halachic ben sorer u'moreh* if his father and mother are identical in appearance, height and voice. Since the likelihood of mother and father being identical is nil, the *gemara* tells us that a *ben sorer u'moreh* never happened and never will. If so, why write it? The *gemara* explains *drosh v'kabel schar*, expound upon it and you will be rewarded. But, at the end of the day, what lesson is the Torah trying to bring out by demanding that a child must have identical parents in order to be put to death as a *ben sorer u'moreh*?

Rav Shlomo Zalman Auerbach is cited in a number of sources as having derived a vital parenting lesson from the rules related to *ben sorer u'moreh*. Rav Shlomo Zalman explained that we

generally hold such a child culpable for his actions and we punish him for those actions. However, if that child could not help but be wayward through no fault of his own, we would not hold him culpable and we would not punish him. What the *possuk* is teaching us here is that if the father and mother don't speak with one voice and do not present one unified picture, then it is not the child's fault that he has gone so bad. It is the fault of his parents. As Rav Shlomo Zalman explains, parents have to be on the same page in order for their kids to have a fair shot at turning out OK. If parents aren't on the same page, don't blame the kid!

Ra Shlomo Zalman's message is so vital for parents, and especially for parents raising children in the complex world in which we live. Often, mother and father may have very different values and very different views on what is or isn't appropriate for their children. Even when parents share the same core values and wants for their kids, they may disagree on the specifics of implementation. Is he old enough to walk there by himself? Should we get her the iPod touch? Should we let him play at that friend's house? Is our child ready for a cell phone? These are all issues that parents will grapple with, and if mother and father aren't prepared to answer as one, they are courting trouble and trouble is likely to find them.

When a child knows that his mother and father disagree on a particular issue, he will play them off of one another to his advantage. Divide and conquer is the child's strategy. In addition, when parental disagreements are played out in front of the children, often the authority of one or both parents is undermined as the child sees that the parent's opinion may not be the final say.

That does not mean that parents cannot or should not disagree about issues of child rearing. The give and take of differing opinions will enrich and enhance the conversation about how you will raise your kids. But, keep those discussions behind the scenes. Learn how to come to a consensus between yourselves and once you have agreed that this is how you will proceed on a particular issue, back it 100 percent. You may not like that you lost and you may not be happy that this is the decision, but part of being an adult and being part of a team is that you tow the party line and you fully support the team decision. When you are prepared to answer the tough questions your kids will ask you because you have discussed the issues together and you are on the same page, your child will see two people speaking in an identical voice. That sets your child up to succeed in life.

SUPPER- Mesivta and Beis Medrash: Suppers are provided by Ephi's Catering under the hashgacha of Rabbi Yitzchok Heimowitz of Yeshiva Shaarei Torah. *For students in grades 9-12 who are not in dorm, supper is only served on days that the Mesivta has regular English sessions. Dorm Meal Option (F) supper is served all days, even those when there are no regular English sessions.
