A Success Set-Up

The Chiddushei HaRim offers a beautifully elegant perspective on what is an otherwise perplexing gemara in maseches Chagiga dealing with the mitzvah of hakhel. Hakhel is the mitzvah for all the Jewish people to gather in the mikdash on chol Hamoed Succos immediately following the shemitta year and for the king to read before them sefer Devarim. In instructing the mitzvah of hakhel, the Torah directs us to gather the men, the women, and the small children. The gemara notes that the men would come for the purpose of Torah study, the women would come to hear, but, asks the gemara, what would be the purpose of bringing the small children? To that, the gemara responds enigmatically, in order for Hashem to reward those who bring them. The enigma: why instruct a meaningless, purposeless commandment with the only purpose to reward those who follow it?

The Chiddushei HaRim asks what should be a rather obvious question. If all of the men and all of the women from the entire country had to report to Yerushalayim and to the mikdash, who would have been left to babysit the young children? Clearly, there would have been no one to watch the kids. If so, then the children would have to have been brought along even if there was no explicit command to bring them!

That, says the Chidushei HaRim, is precisely the point. The Ribono Shel Olam, fully aware that we would bring the children anyway, made it a positive mitzvah to do so in order to reward us for it. What an amazing insight and lesson: if they're going to do it anyway, make it a mitzvah and reward them for doing it!

The chiddushei HaRim brings to mind a parallel construct in child rearing. Howard Glasser is the creator of a framework for dealing with challenging children entitled, The Nurtured Heart Approach. In truth, The Nurtured Heart Approach is effective for all children and is simply a methodology for implanting cogent, sensible, and effective parenting and child raising techniques. One of the three core components of the approach is the need to create a pattern of reinforcing and encouraging positive behavior on the part of children through constant recognition. In the words of the program:

> I will relentlessly and strategically pull the child into new patterns of success. I will constantly recognize the success and achievement that children are displaying no matter how small and present them with

clear undeniable evidence of their value and how great they are.

The program breaks down the recognition that we offer our children into four distinct categories. The common thread that unites these categories is that if we take the things that are kids are doing anyway and we acknowledge and recognize the things they are doing as good, we will reinforce the behavior and create a loop that will drive their behavior in the positive direction. Your child came to the dinner table when called. Recognize it, call it out, and praise him for it. Why? He's coming anyway. Precisely. But, now you have made that coming into a mitzvah and you have changed the dynamic of your relationship with that child. Now you are offering him positive feedback and he is on the receiving end of that positive feedback.

Challenging children can get stuck in a destructive loop of negative feedback and negative behavior that can quickly spiral out of control. The Nurtured Heart Approach offers a simple, sensible way to change the paradigm and drive you to a loop of positive feedback and positive behavior that can spiral upward just as quickly. Look for the *hakhel* moments in your children's lives where you can find reason to reward them with praise and recognition for the positive things they are already doing. Doing so can be life-changing for you and for your children. You will be rewarded greatly for doing so.




