

Pass It On

From the roots of this commandment [that it is to serve as] a hint to Israel that though they will suffer many troubles in the exile by the hand of the nations and by the hand of the [descendants] of Esav (i.e. the Christians), [the Jews] should trust that they will not perish, but rather that their descendants and name will stand firm forever, and that their redeemer will come and redeem them from their oppressor. And in continually remembering this idea through the commandment that serves as a reminder, they will stand firm in their faith and righteousness forever.

One of the more well-known episodes of this week's parasha is the wrestling match between Yaakov and the mysterious angel, whom the chachomim identify as the sar of Eisav. The entire episode is strange, from the initial fight through to the demand for a bracha that Yaakov makes of the malach before allowing him to take leave. The Torah describes how the angel, realizing he was incapable of defeating Yaakov, still managed to hobble Yaakov by touching him in his thigh (or hip socket). That touch of the angel caused Yaakov to be lame the rest of his life. How do we understand the touch of an angel? Why the hip socket?

The Ramba"n offers us perspective on the story by explaining that the entire episode is an allusion to the future generations of b'nei Yisroel. Essentially, when the malach realized he would be unable to defeat Yaakov, he decided instead to try his hand at conquering Yaakov's descendants. The thigh of Yaakov is metaphor for all future offspring that will descend from him.

The sefer Hachinuch explains the prohibition of gid hanashe that emanates from this episode as a constant reminder to the descendants of Yaakov that despite the hardships and sufferings that we will endure through bitter exiles, we will not be made extinct, but will endure and reach the final redemption.

When the malach engages Yaakov in this epic battle, he looks for a vulnerability in what seem to be Yaakov's impenetrable defenses. He finds that vulnerability in the children, the descendants of Yaakov. For, while Yaakov has the strength of faith to withstand the challenge of the malach of Eisav, will his descendants have that same faith?

Our mission and charge as parents is to transmit the mesorah, the heritage, and the strength of faith of our predecessors to our descendants. We, ourselves, are a link in the chain that stretches back to the avos and forward until the end of days. We are also charged with the task of forging the next link in that chain, raising children who will one day take the heritage we pass on to them and transmit it to their children. Having children is the single greatest privilege and the single greatest responsibility in Judaism. Our children are the future and the continuity of the Jewish people.

Many of our forebears went through fire and ice to preserve our heritage and way of life so that it would endure and pass to coming generations. Many were tortured by inquisition and burned at the stake so that they could keep the torch of our heritage burning through the long night of exile. That torch has now been passed to us. We are the keepers of that precious mesorah. But, it is not ours to own. Rather, we are the guardians of this sacred tradition and we are to protect and guard it with everything that we have and everything that we are so that it can pass intact to the next generation.

The past of the Jewish people is filled with the heroes who gave up everything so that we can endure. The future is our children to whom we pass the chain of the *mesorah* and the strength of the faith of our forebears. The malach of Eisav saw the challenge of transmission as the weakness of Yaakov. Our mission is to defeat Eisav by making it a strength.

Be cognizant of the greatness of the mission you are charged with as a Jewish parent. Be faithful and loyal to those who preceded you and, at great sacrifice, preserved this mesorah and handed it to you. Guard it, protect it, and pass it on to the next generation. Don't be the weak link!

Dear Parent/Guardian,

Yes, it is THAT time of year again! The "I don't feel well", stuffy, coughing, sore throat season for all of us.

Let us help each other through it.

We want to maintain good health and well-being in our boys and staff, so we ask that you please keep your son home if he is not feeling well and/or presents any symptoms of illness, with or without fever.

If he is well, make sure he dresses appropriate to the weather as the boys are inside and outside throughout the day.

The following are some signs/symptoms indicating that your child should remain home:

- · Fever of 100.0 or more
- · Thick yellow or green mucous from nose
- · Earache
- · Rash (that is not normal for your child)
- · Sore throat (until strep is ruled out)
- · Persistent/productive cough
- · Diarrhea, nausea, or vomiting
- · Persistent abdominal discomfort
- · Achiness, lethargy

It is important that your child remain at home until:

- · He has been afebrile (without a fever) for 24 hrs. without the use of Tylenol, Motrin....
- · If he is recovering from the flu, it is recommended to stay home for 48 hrs. after fever resolves.
- · He has no signs of diarrhea, nausea, or vomiting for 24 hrs.
- · If antibiotics are prescribed, a full day of medication is taken (and of course he should remain on antibiotics for the full course of treatment, even if he seems better.)
- · He feels better

**When medication is needed during school hours, PLEASE bring me a note from your Doctor.

As always, our children need plenty of sleep, physical activity, water, and nutritionally balanced foods to stay well, physically and emotionally.


