

PARENTING in PARSHA

Family First

דברו אל כל עדת ישראל לאמר בעשר לחדש הזה ויקחו להם איש שה **לבית אבת שה לבית**Speak to the whole community of Israel and say that on the tenth of this month each of them shall take a lamb to a family, a lamb to a household.

ויקרא משה לכל זקני ישראל ויאמר אלהם משכו וקחו לכם צאן **למשפחתיכם** ושחטו הפסח Moses then summoned all the elders of Israel and said to them, "Go, pick out lambs for your families, and slaughter the Passover offering.

Amy Wax is a professor at the University of Pennsylvania Law school who found herself in a heap of trouble after she penned an op-ed in The Philadelphia Enquirer in which she extolled the virtues of the culture of 1950's America. In that opinion piece, Professor Wax pointed to a laundry list of societal ills that are directly tied to the breakdown of that culture. The values of that culture, in her words:

"Get married before you have children and strive to stay married for their sake. Get the education you need for gainful employment, work hard, and avoid idleness. Go the extra mile for your employer or client. Be a patriot, ready to serve the country. Be neighborly, civic-minded, and charitable. Avoid coarse language in public. Be respectful of authority. Eschew substance abuse and crime."

For taking the controversial position of advocating family values, and of tying the breakdown of society to the breakdown of those values, Wax was excoriated by the leftwing academic establishment and by her colleagues at the law school, and was barred from teaching her first-year law course. But, she is correct that family sits at the center of moral and virtuous life.

The Torah places great emphasis on family. The stories of *Bereishis* are essentially the stories of families. Even more profoundly, the critical points in our calendar year where we transmit the events, values, and ideals of our religious life are centered around family. Consider, for example, the Pesach *seder*. It is the basis of all of our faith as we transmit the experience of *Yetzias Mitzrayim* to the next generation. That experience takes place not in the *shul*, nor the *bais*


medrash, but in the context of families sitting down together at a festive table. That structure is by design, as the Torah instructs that the korban Pesach be a family affair. Likewise, the celebration of Purim, as described in the megilah and as played out in practice, and the celebration of Chanukah take place in the context of the family.

In the riveting book, A River in Darkness, Masaji Ishikawa recounts his harrowing experience growing up in and eventually escaping from North Korea. In the book, Ishikawa reveals a truth about all totalitarian regimes. Every totalitarian regime attempts to substitute the state for the family as the core component of society. Totalitarian regimes break up families and brainwash their citizenry to loyalty to the state instead of to the family. Cruelty, injustice, and repression can only survive where there is no family unit to combat it.

The family is the response to oppression and immorality. It is the beacon of light in an otherwise dark world. We need to appreciate the value of the family and the value of our own families. No matter how great the Yeshiva we send our children to may be, it can never take the place of the values learned in the home from the family.

The basic building block of a Torah society is the family. In our families we are taught values, we learn loyalty, we develop a sense of duty and commitment. Sometimes, we mistakenly believe that our Yeshiva system is a substitute for the family unit. It is a supplement, not a substitute.



Dear Parents, עמו"ש

An acquaintance asked Rav Gamliel Rabinovich, a renowned *Mekubal* in *Yerushalayim*, for a ברכה on behalf of an ailing relative. Part of his response was to tell the family to have the children (and adults) make ברכות out loud because "ברכות bring ברכות".

Each year, there is a community ברכות program where the children can claim a prize in different stores after making five ברכות out loud each day for a week. The obvious goal is to have the children learn the importance of ברכות and to accustom themselves to making ברכות out loud, enunciating each word. As in all facets of *chinuch*, the greatest impact on a child is when the mitzvah or *middah* permeates the atmosphere. To this end, we are imploring all parents to help create this atmosphere at home. This "atmosphere" can be created by doing the following:

- Make ברכות out loud.
- Have your children answer ברכות in addition to your answering in to their ברכות.
- When possible, make a ברכה אחרונה out loud .On שבת sing the benching with your children

By creating a "ברכות atmosphere" in your home, Hashem will אי"ה send His to you and your family.
