Important Schedule Changes Schedule


Sunday, June 21st - Due to a faculty meeting, talmidim will only have their first session 10:00-11:00



Negativity Bias

One of the most important insights that modern psychology has offered us into the human mind is the constant presence of negativity bias. Negativity bias is the tendency to notice and recall bad news and negative events in far greater quantity than good news or positive events. Psychologists see this phenomenon as an evolutionary adaptation of the brain. Overlooking the positive carries little risk, but miss a negative and it might be the end of you. However, that protective adaptation can be very harmful in human relationships.

Ray Chaim Shmuelevitz, in a beautiful discussion of the sin of the meraglim, sees their negativity bias as the root cause of their sin and the impetus for their punishment. As Rav Chaim observes, the poetic justice of condemnation to one year in the midbar for each day of the sin of the meraglim isn't as fitting as it seems on the surface. The actual sin of the meraglim was only a few moments of slandering the Land of Israel, not the forty-day journey through the land.

Ray Chaim explains that the lashon hara spoken by the meraglim is really a symptom of a more insidious, underlying problem. People speak negatively when they view things negatively. The real problem of the meraglim wasn't the words they spoke, but the forty days they spent traveling through the land focusing only on the negative and not seeing the positive. With so much good to see, the meraglim fell to the trap of negativity bias. In doing so, they condemned themselves and their generation to die a slow, drawn-out death in the desert, one year for each day of only noticing the bad.

Negativity bias causes parents to be frustrated with children and causes them to focus on the negative behaviors of their children. The more parents notice and criticize the negative, the more children begin to believe in their own inadequacy, and that becomes a self-fulfilling prophecy. Negativity bias also

harms marriages, eroding shalom bayis as spouses overlook all the good done for them and focus, laser-like, on any bad.

What can we do about negativity bias? Like all other biases, the first step is to be aware of its existence. Once you know it's there, you begin to look for it and you can stop yourself from falling into its trap. The second step is to fight fire with fire. That means that we need to consciously focus on the good that is around us and to make note of it.

Often, when dealing with children who are overly negative in their outlook, we insist that before they share any bad news with us, they must share at least one good thing that happened. We should do the same thing with ourselves. Whenever you notice anything bad, pause and find a blessing to count. That is especially important when dealing with your children. You may be frustrated with a child, and you may be justified in that frustration. You may have told your son to clean his room onehundred times already, and he still hasn't done so. But, that negative shouldn't obscure how nicely he treats his younger sister, or how well he did at the doctor.

Try not to just notice the positive in your children, but to point it out to them, as well. Let them know how you noticed them being responsible, careful, conscientious, etc. Do more than point out the positive behaviors. Name the character traits that those behaviors exemplify. The more you notice and make note of the good in your children, the more you will come to believe in their goodness. More importantly, the more you notice the good, the more they will believe in their own goodness, and the more that goodness will be realized as they go through life.
