Every kid is one caring adult away from being a success story

He is a great *tsaddik*, the greatest of his generation, and perhaps an all-time great. He has the faith to stand up against withering criticism and threats of death, and spend 120 years building an ark for the impeding deluge. And yet, when the big day finally arrives, he hesitates. Noach, as Rashi tells us, only goes into the *teivah* when forced to do so by the rising floodwaters, not believing that the flood would actually materialize.

The question is glaring and obvious. How can Noach, the greatest of his generation, be counted among those of little faith? Among the many answers, one subtly shifts a comma in Rashi, so that his comment reads not "Even Noach was among the little of faith, believing, yet not believing that the flood would arrive." Instead, Rashi would be read, "Even Noach had faith in those of little faith, therefore not believing that the flood would arrive." It is a clever read of Rashi, and one with a profound, nuanced lesson for us all.

Ultimately, Noach failed to elevate the people of his time, and consequently failed to stave off the destruction of the world. But his perspective is one that is worth our attention. Noach displayed faith in people whom no one would have faith in. Even until the last minute, when all seemed lost, Noach maintained his belief in the people, and his hope they could still change and improve. There is a powerful lesson for parents and for all adults who are charged with caring for children.

Often, children will lack inner self-confidence and self-assurance, and they will need to have that faith supplied from the outside. That confidence comes in the form of an adult who believes in the child and gets that child, in turn, to believe in himself of herself. From the time our toddlers take their first tentative steps, they are on a nonstop train of new undertakings and challenges that can be frightening, daunting and downright intimidating. When the child begins to doubt himself, it is the calm, still voice of a parent, grandparent, older sibling, teacher, or mentor that whispers in the child's ear and lets him know not to give up because "you got this."

Noach, in his unwavering faith in the generation, modeled the faith we need to display in those under our charge.

But, Noach's faith carries a second, equally important lesson. Faith and belief are not always enough. Sometimes there are real, underlying problems that must be solved and no matter how much confidence you express in your child, those problems will not go away by themselves. Noach's faith in the people was not sufficient to overcome their immorality and corruption. Likewise, when a child is genuinely struggling with a disability or a developmental delay, all the faith in the world in him will not change that.

In fact, when an adult tries to substitute faith and belief in a child for real, substantive help on any underlying issues, the effect is opposite of that intended. Rather than getting the

child to achieve the intended goal, because he cannot, the child learns that the adult's faith in him is misplaced, and that he was right all along to believe in his inability. That undermines the adult's ability to instill confidence in the child for things he is capable of doing, for he has been conditioned to believe that faith to be misguided.

I have had numerous encounters with parents over the years where I have told them that there is nothing wrong with their child that a little bit of faith, confidence, and belief in him from his parents will not cure. But I have also had multiple conversations with parents of children who were truly struggling with real issues who kept insisting that all the child needs is for his teachers and *rebbeim* to show faith and belief in him. Sadly, as Noach has shown us, faith and belief in the person are not always sufficient to carry the day.

The key is to be open and honest in one's child-rearing. Listen open-mindedly to the other adults in your child's life who can help you determine when to be a cheerleader and when to seek help. Believe in your children and give them the support they need so that they will have reason to believe in themselves.
