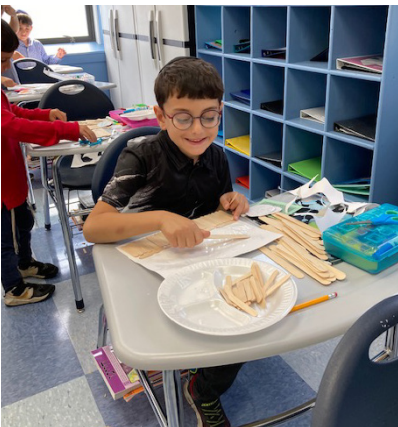

## האזינו Cynicism

וַיֵּרָא ה' וַיִּנְאֹץ מִכַּעַס בָּנָיו וּבָנֹתָיו:

Hashem saw and was vexed, and spurned His sons and His daughters.

A cynic is a man who knows the price of everything, and the value of nothing

-Oscar Wilde

The *gemara* in *kesuvos* offers a frightening consequence for parents who provoke the anger of G-d, citing the *possuk* in this week's *parsha* indicating that children will *chas v'shalom* die young as a result. The proposed consequence is frightening enough to drive anyone to stay in line, but is curious, especially in light of the principle that children are generally not punished for the sins of the fathers.

Many commentators distinguish between underage children, who may fall victim to the consequences of their parents' misdeeds, vs. children over the age of majority who can no longer suffer the fallout of the sins of their fathers. I might suggest, however, that the *gemara* here is offering a firm lesson in parental attitude and how it affects our children.

The word choice in the *possuk* is instructive. The word *וַיִּנְאֹץ* has a connotation that implies more than just

provoke. Some render the word as "abhor," a translation that adds color to its meaning. You may

recognize the root from the *viduy* we said on Yom Kippur, נִאֲצָנוּ. The word implies more than just the act

of sin. It is an attitude that belittles and demeans G-d and religion. We have a word for it in English. That

word is cynicism.

Being raised in the milieu of Orthodox Jewish life is a double-edged sword. On the one hand, there is the comfort and ease of the familiar. We are not foreigners in a *shul* or in a *Bais medrash*. One who comes to Torah on his or her own later in life may be somewhat lost and confused.

But, that latecomer to Judaism is likely to enter a *shul* wide-eyed with awe and reverence, while those who have grown up with it will be hard-pressed to be impressed. Too often that comfort and familiarity crosses the line to cynicism.

Cynicism fits the Justice Potter Stewart standard. It is hard to

define, but you know it when you see it. The cynic has plenty to say about *rabbanim*, about his children's schools, and about *shuls* and other Jewish institutions, and most of what he says isn't flatterer.

The cynic questions the sincerity and motivation of *roshei yeshiva* and *rebbeim*, wondering aloud if they are in it for the money or the *kavod*, but certain that they aren't in it for the sake of Heaven. Likewise, the cynic questions those who work on behalf of the *shul*, and shares his wisdom on the corruption involved in tuition costs, *shul* membership fees and organizations of *tzedakah* and *chessed*.

Yes, every cynic has a kernel of truth on which to base his beliefs and thoughts, but the cynic cannot see any good because he is too focused on the bad. And, when the cynic constantly shares his thoughts with his children, he converts those children to young cynics, and that is deadly for children.

Youthful vigor is built on optimism, hope, and belief in the ability to do good and to effect change in the world. Cynicism is the pinnacle of hopelessness, frustration and doubt. Hope is life. Cynicism is death. The Torah tells us in this week's *parsha* that one who provokes G-d by his cynicism doesn't only provoke G-d. He destroys his children along the way. The best thing the cynic can do for his children is to keep his thoughts to himself.

Making our children cynical deprives them of their youth and of their shot at life. They may end up finding themselves knocked down by life enough times to become cynical themselves, but they may not. Shouldn't we give them the chance to hope, to believe, and to try to change the world?
