7th Grade Essays on Ancient Ships

Viking Ships by Dovi Silber

The Vikings built ships for raids and war. They also had slower ships for passengers and cargo called Knorrs. The boats were strong enough to cross the open ocean, but were shallow enough that they could go up the river and surprise people in places where no one expected.

The Vikings traveled to many places. They traveled to the British Isles, as far east as Russia, and as far southeast as Turkey. To help them find their way, they invented a type of sun compass. The Vikings sailed close to the shore whenever possible, watching for landmarks. By watching the birds or even the color of the water, an experienced sailor could tell tehm when land was close.

Viking ships were built beside a river or inlet of the sea. They would cut long planks of wood for the sides and shorter pieces for supporting ribs and crossbeams. They used wooden pegs to fasten the pieces together. They stuffed animal wool an sticky tar from pine trees into every joint and crack to keep water out. A ship would have one big square sail made of wool. In some ships, the mast for the sail could be folded down. To steer the ship, one man worked a big steering oar at the back. The Vikings were successful shipbuilders and sailors.
