On the contrary, if you keep silent in this crisis, relief and deliverance will come to the Jews from another quarter, while you and your father's house will perish. And who knows, perhaps you have attained to royal position for just such a crisis."

"For if you are silent" – if you [Esther] are silent now and refrain from advocating on behalf of your nation, ultimately you will be silent in the future and you will have no claim. Why? Because you have the

opportunity to perform good during your life and you [will have] failed to do so.

Sedentary culture is the goal of civilization. It means the end of its lifespan and brings about its corruption. - Ibn Khaldun

Ibn Khaldun is probably the most influential thinker of the last millennium that you've likely never heard of.

Seen as the father of disciplines as diverse as economics, political theory, sociology, and demography, Ibn Khaldun observed the world, recognizing patterns that escaped many who before came him. In his Muqaddimah, Ibn Khaldun traces the rise and fall of nations and empires. He notes that the goal of all societies is to reach sedentary comfort. To get there, people will go to great lengths and endure great sacrifice and suffering. But, once there, comfort becomes the only goal, the people unwilling to suffer or sacrifice, for that would contravene their comfort. It is then, Ibn Khaldun notes, that empires fall, overrun and conquered by others, hungry, driven, and ready to sacrifice everything to rise to the top. Thus the cycle starts anew and continues.

Ibn Khaldun's observation affords a lens through which to view one of the most wellknown and pivotal conversations in Megilas Esther.

Esther has become Queen. She has reached the pinnacle of sedentary comfort. But, her people are in trouble. They may be eradicated. She can help, but to do so she will need to risk losing everything. She is faced with the choice of preserving her comfort or summoning her courage, and Mordechai is well-aware of the decision before her. Mordechai wisely admonishes Esther to consider her legacy and that of her father's house, for she may retain comfort, but she will lose eternity.

Esther chooses wisely.

Are we raising children who would choose the same?

Ibn Khaldun's timeline for the lifecycle of empires paints an ominous picture for the

American experiment. Broader society has pursued and attained sedentary comfort and only wants to be left alone to enjoy that comfort. What about our own children brought up in that broader culture? Do we instill in ther children the values of sacrifice, selflessness, determination, grit, and heroism that would make them stand up for what is right and good in the face of oppression and danger? Or, have we taught our children to avoid risking the loss of their comforts?

The Jewish people have always needed Mordechais and Esthers and we have always found them. As Mordechai told Esther, "If you decide to shrink from the responsibility, someone else will come up and take your place." There will always be that someone. The question we have to ask ourselves is about our own legacy and that of our children. Will they be that someone? How can we train them from the time they are young to be that someone? That is the parenting challenge of Megilas Esther. Are we up for it?
